Jack McGee riding Mark Radium

WILLIAM JOHN McGEE (JACK) 1911 - 1967

Jack McGee was born in 1911 at Far Meadow to Mary Ann McGee and William (Billy) Henry McGee.

Jack's father, Billy, was a legendary horseman, competing as a high jump rider but especially renowned as a gifted and patient horse educator.

Jack grew up in Broughton Vale and had a love of agricultural shows from an early age.

In 1920, at age 10, he exhibited at both Berry and Nowra shows. A year later he won every jump event he entered at the Sydney Royal Show! Jack McGee was an outstanding rider and rode many horses, of his own and for various owners, with great success.

Jack played football in Berry and Bowral and helped

his father with the young jumpers and trotters at the Berry Showground.

In 1934 Jack McGee met Mark
Radium - a little black baldy faced
pony gelding - and together they
formed a unique partnership that lasted
until Mark Radium's death in 1955, he was 23.

Bred in Taree by Alec Stewart and after showing early promise as a high jumper for owner George Bell, Mark Radium was sold to Fred Inglebert for 200 pounds. Fred later gifted Mark Radium to Jack.

Jack McGee and Mark Radium became the high jump champions of Australia, jumping 7' 8" at Albury, 7' 6" at Adelaide Royal and 7' 3" at Melbourne shows. From 1947 to 1955 Jack and Mark Radium won every jump event they entered at the Sydney Royal Show, with the exception of 1949 when Mark Radium had pneumonia. He still came second!

Jack had two other high jump horses called Victory and Don, and Jack often placed 1st 2nd and 3rd at the Royal shows.

After Jack returned from service in the Australian Army, he married Miss Norma Bennett in 1948 at St Patrick's Catholic Church in Berry. Norma was on the nursing staff of the David Berry Hospital. Jack and Norma had four children, Veronica, twins Jacqueline and Pamela and a son Mark.

Jack always regarded Berry as his home and Mark Radium was stabled in Berry behind his house at 54-56 Queen Street when not competing.

Mark Radium Park in Berry is dedicated to Jack McGee and Mark Radium.

After retiring from high jumping, Jack had success training and driving his trotting horses at Harold Park and other tracks. One of his standardbreds was called Muidarkram - Mark Radium backwards.

In 1960, Jack was selected to coach the Australian Equestrian Olympic Team, but was pipped at the post for this honour by Franz Mairinger, a past instructor of the Spanish Riding School in Vienna.

Later he joined the staff at the Berry Al centre and would jog to and from his home in Queen Street to work daily.

Jack's fine horsemanship, honesty, Christian family values, kindness and patience with animals and humans will be remembered by his family, the Show community and the people of Berry.



Throughout the weekend you'll see Charlie the Brahman bullock. Be sure to say hello to him as he is ridden around the Showground by his owner Garry Nelson.



- 1. There will be five peas.
- 2. The distance between the start line and the first peg will be 9 metres and there is no limit to the lines of pegs used.
- 3. Each competitor must LEAVE the first peg on their right.
- 4. Each competitor must keep to their own line of pegs. Crossing through other lines will mean disqualification.
- 5. Knocking any peg down will mean disqualification.

- The cask to be a peg with a bag attached to the top to collect the flags. Height of peg when driven in to be 150 cm.
- 5. Each competitor must take the furthest peg first.
- 6. If the cask is knocked down by a competitor, they are to re-erect it before continuing.
- 7. Should the competitor fail to lodge any of the flags in the cask they must dismount, pick up the flag, mount, replace the flag in the cask and finish.
- 8. Each competitor must keep to their own line of pegs. A "line of demarcation" will be drawn or shown 6 metres on each side of each line of pegs, and each competitor must keep within these lines. Crossing these lines will mean disqualification. Should a competitor, while crossing these lines, in doing so, interfere in any degree with another competitor or his horse, the heat, semi-final or final in which the infringement occurs will be stopped as speedily as possible and re-run, but the competitor causing the infringement will be automatically disqualified.



Berry Show encourages the move towards a disease-free status for all exhibits. For 2024 the following conditions will apply:

The Stewards will ensure:

- Tested negative animals will be housed separately from other animals.
- Every effort will be made to immediately remove faecal material to an isolated area.
- · Separate fresh water facilities will be made available.
- EBL (Enzootic Bovine Leucosis) Dairy Cattle are only accepted for exhibit if they originate from "EBL Monitored Free" herd. Certification to this effect must accompany entry form.

General Conditions for Dairy Cattle Section

- A. All cattle must be unloaded and loaded at the loading ramp in Albany Street.
- B. It is compulsory for herd book stock to enter according to birth registration. Entries to be made on the prescribed form, available from the Secretary. The age of registered dairy cattle to be the actual age up to and inclusive of 1st January. Entries close Wed 31st January 2024 7pm
- C. No animal in the Cattle Section can compete in more than one Sub-Section. The owner of any animal so competing shall forfeit all prize moneys at Show.
- D. All animals must be under control, and all cattle must be led around the judging ring.
- E. All paraders are to wear breed dust coats or breed uniforms and enclosed shoes.
- F. No single exhibit will be entitled to more than one first prize, nor will it be allowed to compete, under penalty of disqualification, after winning a first prize, except in Champion, Special Classes, Groups or Pens.

JOHNE'S DISEASE:

- The Society will permit both tested and untested animals.
- The current status of exhibitors' herds must be notified upon entry or prior to judging day.

BIOSECURITY

- As from August 2019, Biosecurity Act has been amended. Livestock farmers need to demonstrate they observe Animal Welfare Standards & Guidelines details at www.mla.com.au/biosecurity. Cattle will not be able to access communal water troughs. Bedding on the ground will be disinfected after use.
- G. All exhibits, having won a prize, except in pens, must parade in the ring, as directed by the Stewards.
- H. Cattle shown in pens will be allowed to compete in single exhibits and vice-versa.
- Cow entered as dry will be allowed to compete as cow in milk (if calved).
- J. The definition of the word "heifer" is a female beast that has never had a calf, and that has no more than six permanent teeth. Exhibitors are to observe this condition when completing the entry form.
- K. Where animals are owned jointly or in syndicates, points for most successful exhibitor or breeder trophies to be awarded to the names jointly or the syndicate, not divided between the owners individually.





The Winner must bake a second Rich Fruit Cake in order to compete in a semi-final to be conducted by each of the fourteen groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. The fourteen winners at group level will each receive a cash prize of \$15 and are required to bake another Rich Fruit Cake for the final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$50.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

RICH FRUIT CAKE Here's what you need:

250g sultanas

250g chopped raisins

250g currants

125g chopped mixed peel

90g chopped red glace cherries

90g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g plain flour

60g self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence

1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

Mix together the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one (1) hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices.

Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures.

Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared **SQUARE 20cm X 20cm** (8" X 8") TIN and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3.5 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 to 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.




